Game

Session 1

Make a obstacle course.

Split the kids into pairs and blindfold one of them

Then by simple language e.g. left, right, forward, back get the shepherds to navigate the blindfolded person around the obstacle course.

Point: -

You may have feelings of mis-trust, be unsure, lack confidence in those guiding you, but in the end you have to trust the words of those who guide you

Discussion

In small groups of two or three answer these questions:-

Do you think you are a Christian? If so why? If not Why?

How do you know you are a Christian?

Have you noticed any changes in your life since you became a Christian?

At the end of discussion feedback to the larger group

Fact file

Each kid is given a copy of “**Fact file**” throughout the weeks. The object of the **fact file** is that at the end of the 9 weeks the kids have a folder of biblical facts and helpful advice that they can use in the future for reference on various subjects.

Explain to the kids that to be a strong Christian we must rely on the facts and promises of the bible not our own feelings. Give a handout to each person and let them answer the first question on their own, then in small groups answer the rest of the questions with facts from the Bible.

Feedback the answers to the whole group

Activity

Give activity sheets out and explain that being a Christian is about giving God complete control of your life. The more you give to God, the deeper your relationship with Him will grow. Ask them to think about their lives and what is important to them. Get them to tick the box that best suits their response to God.

Main Point: -

By relying on facts and giving God the freedom to move in our lives we can know that Jesus loves us, accepts us and has a great plan for our lives
